

#### CLAUSES INCORPORATED BY FULL TEXT

#### 52.211-10 COMMENCEMENT, PROSECUTION, AND COMPLETION OF WORK (APR 1984)

The Contractor shall be required to (a) commence work under this contract within **TEN (10)** calendar days after the date the Contractor receives the notice to proceed, (b) prosecute the work diligently, and (c) complete the entire work ready for use not later than September 30, 2004 . \* The time stated for completion shall include final cleanup of the premises.

\*The Contracting Officer shall specify either a number of days after the date the contractor receives the notice to proceed, or a calendar date.

#### 52.212-5 CONTRACT TERMS AND CONDITIONS REQUIRED TO IMPLEMENT STATUTES OR EXECUTIVE ORDERS--COMMERCIAL ITEMS (JAN 2004) (DEVIATION)

(a) Comptroller General Examination of Record. The Contractor agrees to comply with the provisions of this paragraph (a) if the contract was awarded using other than sealed bid, is in excess of the simplified acquisition threshold, and do not contain the clause at 52.215-2, Audit and Records-Negotiation.

(1) The Comptroller General of the United States, or an authorized representative of the Comptroller General, shall have access to the right to examine any of the Contractor's directly pertinent records involving transactions related to this contract.

(2) The Contractor shall make available at its offices at all reasonable times, the records, materials, and other evidence for examination, audit, or reproduction, until 3 years after final payment under this contract or for any shorter period specified in FAR Subpart 4.7, Contractor Records Retention, of the other clauses of this contract. If this contract is completely or partially terminated, the records relating to the work terminated shall be made available for 3 years after any resulting final termination settlement. Records relating to appeals under the disputes clause or to litigation or the settlement of claims arising under or relating to this contract shall be made available until such appeals, litigation, or claims are finally resolved.

(3) As used in this clause, records include books, documents, accounting procedures and practices, and other data, regardless of form. This does not require the Contractor to create or maintain any record that the Contractor does not maintain in the ordinary course of business or pursuant to a provision of law.

(b) Notwithstanding the requirements of the clauses in paragraphs (a), (b), (c), and (d) of this clause, the Contractor is not required to flow down any FAR clause, other than those in paragraphs (i) through (vi) of this paragraph in a

subcontract for commercial items. Unless otherwise indicated below, the extent of the flow down shall be as required by the clause--

(i) 52.219-8, Utilization of Small Business Concerns (October 2000) (15 U.S.C. 637(d)(2) and (3)), in all subcontracts that offer further subcontracting opportunities. If the subcontract (except subcontracts to small business concerns) exceeds \$500,000 (\$1,000,000 for construction of any public facility), the subcontractor must include 52.219-8 in lower tier subcontracts that offer subcontracting opportunities.

(ii) 52.222-26, Equal Opportunity (April 2002) (E.O. 11246).

(iii) 52.222-35, Equal Opportunity for Special Disabled Veterans, Veterans of the Vietnam Era, and Other Eligible Veterans (December 2001) (38 U.S.C. 4212).

(e) Except for escrow agreements and payment bonds, which provide their own protection procedures, the Contracting Officer is authorized to access funds under the payment protection when it has been alleged in writing by a supplier of labor or material that a nonpayment has occurred, and to withhold such funds pending resolution by administrative or judicial proceedings or mutual agreement of the parties.

(f) When a tripartite escrow agreement is used, the Contractor shall utilize only suppliers of labor and material that

signed the escrow agreement.

#### STATEMENT OF WORK

#### SPECIFICATIONS

I. The contractor shall complete all work for each bridge as listed.

Bridge No. CEPNABPA-000003-Main Access Road /Bridge over Reservoir. Seal cracks in the approach roadways for a minimum distance of 25' from each end of the bridge. Clean and paint the bottom flanges  
Lubricate bearings.

Bridge No. CEPNABPA-000004-Administrative Access Road Bridge- Stephenhouse Run. Remove timber guiderails and install W-beam approach guiderails and bridge guiderails with end treatment [termination assemblies] that meet AASHTO standards. ~~Reconstruct a minimum of 5' of each approach roadway.~~ Seal cracks in the approach roadways for a minimum distance of 25' from each end of the bridge.

Bridge No. CEPNABPA-000005-Campground Area Access Road- Ives Run. Remove timber guiderails and install W-beam approach guiderails and bridge guiderails with end treatment [termination assemblies] that meet AASHTO standards. ~~Reconstruct a minimum of 5' of each approach roadway.~~ Seal cracks in the approach roadways for a minimum distance of 25'

from each end of the bridge. Drill holes through the bottom of the voided slab into the ends of the voids at interval diaphragms. Remove and replace deteriorated concrete along the north edge of the voided slab.

Bridge No. CEPNABPA-000006-Day Use Area Access Road Bridge-Ives Run. Remove the existing riprap and place new R6(30") uniformly graded riprap located to protect the south abutment and wingwalls against scouring. Fill areas behind the wingwalls with topsoil and apply erosion control matting. Remove timber guiderails and install W-beam approach and bridge guiderails with end treatment (termination assemblies) that meet AASHTO standards. **Reconstruct a minimum of 5' of each approach roadway.** Seal cracks in the approach roadways for a minimum distance of 25' from each end of the bridge. Install a 12" layer of R3 riprap a nominal length of 30' along each bank in the upstream channel .

Bridge No. CEXNABPA-000022-Kelly Creek Bridge (Hike and Bike Bridge #1). Replace the guiderails including the end returns with 6"x6" posts and 2"x6" rails pressure treated. Stabilize the slopes with new R6 riprap and placement of a slush concrete over the existing stone and new riprap.

II. Areas designated to be painted shall be thoroughly cleaned of all loose and peeling paint, dirt or other foreign matter. A primer coat shall be applied to the prepared surface prior to application of the finish paint coat. Paint products shall meet pertinent Pennsylvania Department of Transportation specifications for bridge painting and shall require prior approval of the Contracting Officer Representative. No paint shall be applied to wet surfaces or when the forecast is for rain within the next 24 hrs. also no paint shall be applied when the ambient air temperature is below 50 degrees or forecast to go below 50 degrees for the next 24 hrs.

III. Roadway crack sealing shall require all surfaces to be thoroughly clean and dry prior to any application. All cracks greater than 1/4" in width or 1" in depth shall be cleaned of all loose material with high pressure air and filled with a liquid bituminous filler such as used by Pennsylvania Department of Transportation and will require prior approval by the Contracting Officer Representative. Surfaces shall receive 2 coats of quality bituminous coal tar emulsion sealer that will require approval by the Contracting Officer Representative. Application rates shall be adequate to insure proper penetration of surface material and adhesion of sealer to prevent peeling, scaling, or pickup. Sealer shall be worked into surface material by squeegee and be free of thin areas or puddles.

IV. Bridge approach roadways that are to be reconstructed shall have existing surfaces topped with a minimum 1 ½" of blacktop wearing surface course of hot mixed asphalt concrete that compares to "PennDot" specification for material class {ID2A}. No blacktop will be placed on wet, muddy or frozen surfaces. All existing surfaces to receive the blacktop shall be milled as necessary to remove any existing bumps or high areas. Surfaces shall be tack coated prior to placement of new wearing surface to provide a good bond with the existing wearing surface. The contractor shall insure that all mixing of the bituminous concrete is accomplished in an approved mixer. The dried aggregate and bituminous material shall be measured or gauged and introduced into the mixer in quantities required to assure homogeneous composition is obtained. The finished mixture shall be such that it may be handled, placed and compacted without stripping the bituminous [asphalt]cement from the aggregate. The asphalt cement shall of the type and grade specified by the job-mix formula and will be heated to uniform temperature to insure continuous uniform supply of bituminous material to the mixer at all times. Aggregate shall meet quality standards for grade and size uniformity as required by the job-mix formula. No bituminous concrete will be placed when the ambient air temperature is below 50 degrees F. Material shall be hauled to the job site in vehicles that have been previously cleaned of all foreign material including any petroleum oils, volatiles or other solvents which may adversely affect the bituminous concrete. Material shall be delivered to the site at the correct laying temperature, free from lumps of chilled material. Limited tonnage of material in route to the project site when work is terminated for the day due to weather conditions may be placed with the approval of the Contracting Officer Representative. All bituminous concrete paving will be constructed as specified in accordance with Penn Dot specifications and standard trade practices. Immediately after the bituminous material has been spread, struck off and surface irregularities adjusted, it shall be thoroughly and uniformly compacted by rolling. Any material that becomes loose, broken, or mixed with dirt shall be removed and replaced with hot material. Finish grades will be true and continuous and all mating surfaces will be even, free of dips, potholes and undulations and blend to adjacent blacktop surfaces. Nominal dimensions of the designated approach roadways are 22' wide by 25' in length. Approximate total 285 square feet.

V. All riprap, hereafter referred to as stone, shall consist of durable stone. Shale and soft or weathered rock will not be accepted. Stone shall be predominantly angular and blocky in shape and shall be free from open or incipient cracks, seams, or other defects that would cause increased deterioration during handling. No stone shall have a length exceeding 3 times its breadth or thickness. Stone shall be free from soil cobbles, gravel deposits, earth, roots, debris or other similar material. Stone shall meet the standard size and gradation requirements for each designated R size riprap.

VI. Guiderails shall be W beam type made of weathering steel. The contractor shall be required to supply and install all items incidental to the guiderail installation. All work shall meet AASHTO Standards and be in compliance PennDot requirements where applicable. Approximate total length of guiderails to be installed is 600'.

VII. Lubrication of bearings shall consist of cleaning and applying an approved lubricant to the exposed surfaces only.

VIII. The contractor shall be required to follow all pertinent safety requirements found in the US ARMY CORPS OF ENGINEERS SAFETY AND HEALTH MANUAL EM 385-1-1. A copy will be furnished to the contractor prior to start of work. Requirements will include but not be limited to wearing of personal protective equipment, traffic control and good housekeeping. Work will be in a Public Use Area and the contractor shall be responsible to provide signing and barriers to protect the public from hazards in the work area. Work hours will be 08:00 AM to 04:00 PM Monday through Friday excluding holidays. All contractor employees and contractor vehicles shall be identified with name tags that include the employees name and the contractors name and telephone number.

IX. Dimensions provided are only estimates and the contractor shall be required to make his own measurements to accomplish the designated work.
