- Formula II – Glyphosate – 4 quarts per acre  
Surfactant, anti-drift agent and colorant as per manufacturer’s Specifications
- Formula III – Unit of product  
Glyphosate – 2 quarts per acre  
Sahara – 10 pounds per acre

#### **C.4. AREA DESCRIPTION**

C.4.1 Foster Joseph Sayers Dam, Beech Creek, PA

A. Foster Sayers Dam

1. Area A

Herbicide – Formula I

All areas within 20' of bodies of water, standing water, and drainage ditches with flowing water. This is to include riprap areas along lakeshore, along the outlet channel and around any headwalls, drainage ditches, etc. with standing or flowing water.

2. Area B

Herbicide – Formula II

All rip rap areas on the lake side of the dam and along the outlet channel that weren't treated with the Formula I as well as areas around or near any trees, bushes, shrubs, etc., and any other areas that could possibly leach into the lake, river, streams or drainage ditches with the onset of a hard rain. In areas of heavy growth or where there seems the likelihood of heavy re-growth, formula III shall be used.

3. Area C

Herbicide – Formula III

Any rip rap areas not covered by Formula I or Formula II mainly the areas on the downstream side of the dam and near and around the spillway. All areas along the edge of all buildings, concrete structures, walks, driveways, parking lots, guardrails, fences, headwalls, gate posts, utility structures, etc. as directed by the designated government representative. All gravel roads will be sprayed. Areas will generally be sprayed 8-12" from all above mentioned objects to eliminate the need of hand trimming of grass and other vegetative growth. Some areas may require wider areas to be sprayed as appropriate. All rip rap areas shall have a 24" border sprayed. Formula III will not be used in areas where there is any possibility of it entering into the root system of any desired vegetation such as trees, shrubs, etc.

B. HOWARD LEVEE

1. Area A  
Herbicide – Formula I  
All areas within 20' of bodies of water, standing water and drainage ditches with flowing water. This is to include riprap areas along lakeshore, and around any headwalls, drainage ditches, etc. with standing or flowing water.
2. Area B  
Herbicide – Formula II  
All rip rap areas on the lake side of the levee and any rip rap areas not covered by Formula I as well as areas around or near any trees, bushes, or shrubs. Any other areas that could possibly leach into the lake, river, streams, or drainage ditches with the onset of a hard rain. In areas of heavy growth or there seems the likelihood of heavy re-growth, formula III shall be used.
3. Area C  
Herbicide – Formula III  
Around all concrete structures, utility structures, head walls and drainage areas on both sides of the embankment. All areas along the edge of all buildings, concrete structures, walks, driveways, parking lots, guardrails, fences, headwalls, gate posts, utility structures, etc. as directed by the designated government representative. All gravel roads will be sprayed. Areas will generally be sprayed 8-12" from all above mentioned objects to eliminate the need of hand trimming of grass and other vegetative growth. Some areas may require wider areas to be sprayed as appropriate. All rip rap areas shall have a 24" border sprayed. Formula III will not be used in areas where there is any possibility of it entering into the root system of any desired vegetation such as trees, shrubs, etc.

C.4.1.2. Indian Rock Dam, York, PA

1. Area A  
Herbicide – Formula I  
All areas within 20' of bodies of water, standing water, and drainage ditches with flowing water. This is to include rip rap areas along both sides of the intake channel, upstream and downstream rip rap embankment of the dam, the rip rap areas and along the spillway wall upstream of the dam, the rip areas on the south end of the spillway and along the creek bank.
2. Area B  
Herbicide – Formula II  
All areas described above not covered with Formula I. Any areas where there may be the presence of root systems of desirable vegetation such as trees, bushes, and shrubs.
3. Area C  
Herbicide – Formula III  
Any areas not covered by Formula I or Formula II. All areas along the edge of all buildings, concrete structures, walks, driveways, parking lots, guardrails, fences, headwalls, gate posts, utility structures, etc., as directed by the designated government representative. All gravel roads will be sprayed. Areas will generally be sprayed 8-12" from all above mentioned objects to eliminate the need of hand trimming of grass and other vegetative growth. Some areas may require wider areas to be sprayed as appropriate. All rip rap areas shall have a 24" border sprayed. Formula III will not be used in areas where there is any possibility of it entering into the root system of any desired vegetation such as trees, shrubs, etc.

B. Corderus Creek Levee Project in the City of York, PA

1. Spraying shall begin at St. 70+00 (downstream of Sewage Treatment Plant) and proceed upstream to the second Railroad Bridge. Spraying will commence again at the College Ave. Bridge and continue to the weir above Richland Ave. (St. 275+00). There shall be no Herbicides applied between the College Ave. Bridge and the nearest downstream railroad bridge. Herbicides shall be applied to rip rap areas around all concrete structures, utility structures, headwalls and drainage structures in both the right and left banks of Corderus Creek, York, PA.

Formula I shall be used within approximately 20' of any standing or flowing water. Formula III shall be used in all other areas unless there is the presence of root growth of desirable plants such as bushes, shrubs or trees.

C.5 **SAFETY**

- C.5.1 The contractor shall be responsible for complying with applicable OSHA Regulation, State and Federal regulations and all applicable regulations contained in the Corps of Engineers Safety Manual EM 385-1-1 as they pertain to the work being performed.
- C.5.2 At the pre-work conference, the contractor shall submit a completed Job-Hazard Analysis for all work to be performed.
- C.5.3 If the Contractor fails or refuses to promptly comply with safety requirements as specified herein, the COR may issue an order to stop all or part of the work affected by the infraction until satisfactory corrective action has been taken. The government shall not be responsible for any lost time or costs incurred due to such stoppage.

C.6 **LIABILITY**

- C.6.1 The Contractor shall be liable for any and all damage to the Environment and/or public or private property be it caused by equipment or chemicals.
- C.6.2 The Contractor shall be liable for any and all injuries to Company Employees, government Employees or the public as a result of his actions.

HEALTH & WELFARE: \$2.36 an hour or \$94.40 a week or \$409.07 a month

VACATION: 2 weeks paid vacation after 1 year of service with a contractor or successor; 3 weeks after 8 years, 4 weeks after 15 years, and 5 weeks after 25 years. Length of service includes the whole span of continuous service with the present contractor or successor, wherever employed, and with the predecessor contractors in the performance of similar work at the same Federal facility.  2) APPLICABLE TO AIR TRAFFIC CONTROLLERS ONLY - NIGHT DIFFERENTIAL: An employee is entitled to pay for all work performed between the hours of 6:00 P.M. and 6:00 A.M. at the rate of basic pay plus a night pay differential amounting to 10 percent of the rate of basic pay.

3) WEATHER OBSERVERS - NIGHT PAY & SUNDAY PAY: If you work at night as part of a regular tour of duty, you will earn a night differential and receive an additional 10% of basic pay for any hours worked between 6pm and 6am. If you are a full-time employed (40 hours a week) and Sunday is part of your regularly scheduled workweek, you are paid at your rate of basic pay plus a Sunday premium of 25% of your basic rate for each hour of Sunday work which is not overtime (i.e. occasional work on Sunday outside the normal tour of duty is considered overtime work).

HAZARDOUS PAY DIFFERENTIAL: An 8 percent differential is applicable to employees employed in a position that represents a high degree of hazard when working with or in close proximity to ordnance, explosives, and incendiary materials. This includes work such as screening, blending, dying, mixing, and pressing of sensitive ordnance, explosives, and pyrotechnic compositions such as lead azide, black powder and photoflash powder. All dry-house activities involving propellants or explosives. Demilitarization, modification, renovation, demolition, and maintenance operations on sensitive ordnance, explosives and incendiary materials. All operations involving regrading and cleaning of artillery ranges.

A 4 percent differential is applicable to employees employed in a position that represents a low degree of hazard when working with, or in close proximity to ordnance, (or employees possibly adjacent to) explosives and incendiary materials which involves potential injury such as laceration of hands, face, or arms of the employee engaged in the operation, irritation of the skin, minor burns and the like; minimal damage to immediate or adjacent work area or equipment being used. All operations involving, unloading, storage, and hauling of ordnance, explosive, and incendiary ordnance material other than small arms ammunition. These differentials are only applicable to work that has been specifically designated by the agency for ordnance, explosives, and incendiary material differential pay.

\*\* UNIFORM ALLOWANCE \*\*

If employees are required to wear uniforms in the performance of this contract (either by the terms of the Government contract, by the employer, by the state or local law, etc.), the cost of furnishing such uniforms and maintaining (by

laundering or dry cleaning) such uniforms is an expense that may not be borne by an employee where such cost reduces the hourly rate below that required by the wage determination. The Department of Labor will accept payment in accordance with the following standards as compliance:

The contractor or subcontractor is required to furnish all employees with an adequate number of uniforms without cost or to reimburse employees for the actual cost of the uniforms. In addition, where uniform cleaning and maintenance is made the responsibility of the employee, all contractors and subcontractors subject to this wage determination shall (in the absence of a bona fide collective bargaining agreement providing for a different amount, or the furnishing of contrary affirmative proof as to the actual cost), reimburse all employees for such cleaning and maintenance at a rate of \$3.35 per week (or \$.67 cents per day). However, in those instances where the uniforms furnished are made of "wash and wear" materials, may be routinely washed and dried with other personal garments, and do not require any special treatment such as dry cleaning, daily washing, or commercial laundering in order to meet the cleanliness or appearance standards set by the terms of the Government contract, by the contractor, by law, or by the nature of the work, there is no requirement that employees be reimbursed for uniform maintenance costs.

REQUEST FOR AUTHORIZATION OF ADDITIONAL CLASSIFICATION AND WAGE RATE {Standard Form 1444 (SF 1444)}

Conformance Process:

The contracting officer shall require that any class of service employee which is not listed herein and which is to be employed under the contract (i.e., the work to be performed is not performed by any classification listed in the wage determination), be classified by the contractor so as to provide a reasonable relationship (i.e., appropriate level of skill comparison) between such unlisted classifications and the classifications listed in the wage determination. Such conformed classes of employees shall be paid the monetary wages and furnished the fringe benefits as are determined. Such conforming process shall be initiated by the contractor prior to the performance of contract work by such unlisted class(es) of employees. The conformed classification, wage rate, and/or fringe benefits shall be retroactive to the commencement date of the contract. {See Section 4.6 (C) (vi)} When multiple wage determinations are included in a contract, a separate SF 1444 should be prepared for each wage determination to which a class(es) is to be conformed.

The process for preparing a conformance request is as follows:

- 1) When preparing the bid, the contractor identifies the need for a conformed occupation) and computes a proposed rate).
- 2) After contract award, the contractor prepares a written report listing in order proposed classification title), a Federal grade equivalency (FGE) for each proposed classification), job description), and rationale for proposed wage rate), including information regarding the agreement or disagreement of the authorized representative of the employees involved, or where there is no authorized representative, the employees themselves. This report should be submitted to the contracting officer no later than 30 days after such unlisted class(es) of employees performs any contract work.
- 3) The contracting officer reviews the proposed action and promptly submits a report of the action, together with the agency's recommendations and pertinent information including the position of the contractor and the employees, to the Wage and Hour Division, Employment Standards Administration, U.S. Department of Labor, for review. (See section 4.6(b)(2) of Regulations 29 CFR Part 4).
- 4) Within 30 days of receipt, the Wage and Hour Division approves, modifies, or disapproves the action via transmittal to the agency contracting officer, or notifies the contracting officer that additional time will be required to process the request.
- 5) The contracting officer transmits the Wage and Hour decision to the contractor.
- 6) The contractor informs the affected employees.

Information required by the Regulations must be submitted on SF 1444 or bond paper. When preparing a conformance request, the "Service Contract Act Directory of Occupations" (the Directory) should be used to compare job definitions to insure that duties requested are not performed by a classification already listed in the wage determination. Remember, it is not the job title, but the required tasks that determine whether a class is included in an established wage determination. Conformances may not be used to artificially split, combine, or subdivide classifications listed in the wage determination.

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ALL OCCUPATIONS LISTED ABOVE RECEIVE THE FOLLOWING BENEFITS:

HEALTH & WELFARE: \$2.36 an hour or \$94.40 a week or \$409.07 a month

VACATION: 2 weeks paid vacation after 1 year of service with a contractor or successor; and 3 weeks after 10 years. Length of service includes the whole span of continuous service with the present contractor or successor, wherever employed, and with the predecessor contractors in the performance of similar work at the same Federal facility. (Reg. 29 CFR 4.173)

HOLIDAYS: A minimum of ten paid holidays per year: New Year's Day, Martin Luther King Jr.'s Birthday, Washington's Birthday, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Columbus Day, Veterans' Day, Thanksgiving Day, and Christmas Day. (A contractor may substitute for any of the named holidays another day off with pay in accordance with a plan communicated to the employees involved.) (See 29 CFR 4.174)

THE OCCUPATIONS WHICH HAVE PARENTHESES AFTER THEM RECEIVE THE FOLLOWING BENEFITS (as numbered):

1) Does not apply to employees employed in a bona fide executive, administrative, or professional capacity as defined and delineated in 29 CFR 541. (See CFR 4.156)  
 2) APPLICABLE TO AIR TRAFFIC CONTROLLERS ONLY - NIGHT DIFFERENTIAL: An employee is entitled to pay for all work performed between the hours of 6:00 P.M. and 6:00 A.M. at the rate of basic pay plus a night pay differential amounting to 10 percent of the rate of basic pay.

3) WEATHER OBSERVERS - NIGHT PAY & SUNDAY PAY: If you work at night as part of a regular tour of duty, you will earn a night differential and receive an additional 10% of basic pay for any hours worked between 6pm and 6am. If you are a full-time employed (40 hours a week) and Sunday is part of your regularly scheduled workweek, you are paid at your rate of basic pay plus a Sunday premium of 25% of your basic rate for each hour of Sunday work which is not overtime (i.e. occasional work on Sunday outside the normal tour of duty is considered overtime work).

HAZARDOUS PAY DIFFERENTIAL: An 8 percent differential is applicable to employees employed in a position that represents a high degree of hazard when working with or in close proximity to ordinance, explosives, and incendiary materials. This includes work such as screening, blending, dying, mixing, and pressing of sensitive

ordnance, explosives, and pyrotechnic compositions such as lead azide, black powder and photoflash powder. All dry-house activities involving propellants or explosives. Demilitarization, modification, renovation, demolition, and maintenance operations on sensitive ordnance, explosives and incendiary materials. All operations involving regrading and cleaning of artillery ranges.

A 4 percent differential is applicable to employees employed in a position that represents a low degree of hazard when working with, or in close proximity to ordnance, (or employees possibly adjacent to) explosives and incendiary materials which involves potential injury such as laceration of hands, face, or arms of the employee engaged in the operation, irritation of the skin, minor burns and the like; minimal damage to immediate or adjacent work area or equipment being used. All operations involving, unloading, storage, and hauling of ordnance, explosive, and incendiary ordnance material other than small arms ammunition. These differentials are only applicable to work that has been specifically designated by the agency for ordnance, explosives, and incendiary material differential pay.

**\*\* UNIFORM ALLOWANCE \*\***

If employees are required to wear uniforms in the performance of this contract (either by the terms of the Government contract, by the employer, by the state or local law, etc.), the cost of furnishing such uniforms and maintaining (by laundering or dry cleaning) such uniforms is an expense that may not be borne by an employee where such cost reduces the hourly rate below that required by the wage determination. The Department of Labor will accept payment in accordance with the following standards as compliance:

The contractor or subcontractor is required to furnish all employees with an adequate number of uniforms without cost or to reimburse employees for the actual cost of the uniforms. In addition, where uniform cleaning and maintenance is made the responsibility of the employee, all contractors and subcontractors subject to this wage determination shall (in the absence of a bona fide collective bargaining agreement providing for a different amount, or the furnishing of contrary affirmative proof as to the actual cost), reimburse all employees for such cleaning and maintenance at a rate of \$3.35 per week (or \$.67 cents per day). However, in those instances where the uniforms furnished are made of "wash and wear" materials, may be routinely washed and dried with other personal garments, and do not require any special treatment such as dry cleaning, daily washing, or commercial laundering in order to meet the cleanliness or appearance standards set by the terms of the Government contract, by the contractor, by law, or by the nature of the work, there is no requirement that employees be reimbursed for uniform maintenance costs.

**\*\* NOTES APPLYING TO THIS WAGE DETERMINATION \*\***

**Source of Occupational Title and Descriptions:**

The duties of employees under job titles listed are those described in the "Service Contract Act Directory of Occupations," Fourth Edition, January 1993, as amended by the Third Supplement, dated March 1997, unless otherwise indicated. This publication may be obtained from the Superintendent of Documents, at 202-783-3238, or by writing to the Superintendent of Documents, U.S. Government Printing Office, Washington, D.C. 20402. Copies of specific job descriptions may also be obtained from the appropriate contracting officer.

REQUEST FOR AUTHORIZATION OF ADDITIONAL CLASSIFICATION AND WAGE RATE {Standard Form 1444 (SF 1444)}

**Conformance Process:**

The contracting officer shall require that any class of service employee which is not listed herein and which is to be employed under the contract (i.e., the work to be performed is not performed by any classification listed in the wage determination), be classified by the contractor so as to provide a reasonable relationship (i.e., appropriate level of skill comparison) between such unlisted classifications and the classifications listed in the wage determination. Such conformed classes of employees shall be paid the monetary wages and furnished the fringe benefits as are determined. Such conforming process shall be initiated by the contractor prior to the performance of contract work by such unlisted class(es) of employees. The conformed classification, wage rate, and/or fringe benefits shall be retroactive to the commencement date of the contract. {See Section 4.6 (C) (vi)} When multiple wage determinations are included in a contract, a separate SF 1444 should be prepared for each wage determination to which a class(es) is to be conformed.

The process for preparing a conformance request is as follows:

- 1) When preparing the bid, the contractor identifies the need for a conformed occupation) and computes a proposed rate).

- 2) After contract award, the contractor prepares a written report listing in order proposed classification title), a Federal grade equivalency (FGE) for each proposed classification), job description), and rationale for proposed wage rate, including information regarding the agreement or disagreement of the authorized representative of the employees involved, or where there is no authorized representative, the employees themselves. This report should be submitted to the contracting officer no later than 30 days after such unlisted class(es) of employees performs any contract work.
  - 3) The contracting officer reviews the proposed action and promptly submits a report of the action, together with the agency's recommendations and pertinent information including the position of the contractor and the employees, to the Wage and Hour Division, Employment Standards Administration, U.S. Department of Labor, for review. (See section 4.6(b)(2) of Regulations 29 CFR Part 4).
  - 4) Within 30 days of receipt, the Wage and Hour Division approves, modifies, or disapproves the action via transmittal to the agency contracting officer, or notifies the contracting officer that additional time will be required to process the request.
  - 5) The contracting officer transmits the Wage and Hour decision to the contractor.
  - 6) The contractor informs the affected employees.
- Information required by the Regulations must be submitted on SF 1444 or bond paper. When preparing a conformance request, the "Service Contract Act Directory of Occupations" (the Directory) should be used to compare job definitions to insure that duties requested are not performed by a classification already listed in the wage determination. Remember, it is not the job title, but the required tasks that determine whether a class is included in an established wage determination. Conformances may not be used to artificially split, combine, or subdivide classifications listed in the wage determination.

MEMORANDUM FOR ALL CONTRACTORS

SUBJECT: Central Contractor Registration (CCR)

1. Reference memorandum, CEDB, dated June 26, 1997, subject: Central Contractor Registration.
2. The purpose of this memorandum is to advise all contractors that your company must be registered in the CCR or you will not be awarded a Federal contract.
3. The Debt Collection Improvement Act of 1996, requires Federal agencies to have the Taxpayer Identification Number (TIN) for every contractor and to pay every contractor through electronic funds transfer. The CCR registration was also created to be the single source of contractor data for the entire DoD, to avoid administrative duplication and allow contractors to take responsibility for the accuracy of their own business information supplying it through a single registration.
4. CCR allows Federal Government contractors to provide basic information,

capabilities, and financial information one time to the government. This requirement applies to all solicitations and awards. The only exemptions will be for purchases made with the Government wide commercial purchase card, contracting offices located outside the U.S., classified contracts, and contracts executed to support contingency or emergency operations.

5. The Department of Defense (DoD) has implemented the capability for contractors to register in the CCR through the World Wide Web. For information regarding CCR registration, the CCR Web site may be accessed at <http://www.ccr.gov/index.cfm>.

Other information regarding registration can be obtained through CCR Assistance Center (CCRAC) at 1-888-227-2423. A paper form for registration may be obtained from the DoD Electronic Commerce Information Center at 1-800-334-3414. (Note: Companies that do not wish to conduct electronic commerce with the Federal Government at this time can reduce the amount of information they must provide by answering "no" to the question "Are you Electronic Data Interchange capable?")

6. Effective immediately, the use of DUNS+4 numbers to identify vendors is limited to identifying different CCR records for the same vendor at the same physical location. For example a vendor could have two records for themselves at the same physical location to identify two separate bank accounts.

- Vendors wishing to register their subsidiaries and other entities, should ensure that each additional location obtains a separate DUNS number from Dun & Bradstreet. Dun & Bradstreet can be contacted at 1-800-333-0505.

SUBJECT: Central Contractor Registration (CCR)

- Vendors that are currently registered in CCR using a DUNS+4 number for reasons other than mentioned above will be contacted by a CCR Team designated to assist in the change. Until at time, all registrations using the DUNS+4 are considered active and complete. The DUNS+4 vendors require no action until they receive instruction from the designated CCR Team.
